OUR COMMITMENT TO PATIENTS

Especially in uncertain times like these, we know that people's sexual and reproductive health care can't wait. We continue to meet the needs of our patients each day, providing them essential care regardless of their ability to pay.

HOW WE ARE DELIVERING CARE SAFELY

The safety of our staff, patients, and communities is our top priority. As such, **more than 60% of our appointments are now being provided through telehealth** – over the phone or over a secure video conference. We also continue to offer inperson and curbside visits when necessary. We are providing STD screening and treatment, birth control, abortion care, social work interventions, and more.

As always, it is life-changing, and at times lifesaving, care. We know that when STDs go untreated, when cancer goes undetected, and when people can't access contraception and abortion care, there is a very real strain placed on our communities and on the health care system.

With your help, PPNNE served more than 44,000 patients across Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont last year, and we will continue to be there for them and anyone else who needs care.

We know that low income and vulnerable populations are being impacted the most during this pandemic. That is why we are maintaining our commitment to provide care regardless of ability to pay.

A WORD FROM OUR HEALTH CENTER STAFF

Here are just some of the ways our health center staff have provided care during this pandemic - **and what your support helps make possible.**

It can be difficult for patients in rural areas to access health care due to transportation scarcity. Telehealth was able to overcome this obstacle for a patient I saw last week. She works at a dairy farm, and developed a Urinary Tract Infection. Our visit was conducted while she was in the dairy barn, with cows mooing in the background. She was very appreciative of the visit and was laughing while thanking us at the end of the call.

A woman called very concerned over light bleeding in early pregnancy. She was established with an OB/GYN and was planning to continue the pregnancy but had been told she could not be seen for an ultrasound due to the pandemic. She was able to come to PPNNE and we confirmed that all was well and sent the records to her OB/GYN provider with a follow up plan. PPNNE met the immediate needs of the patient and alleviated strain on the hospital system.

Updates From Our Public Affairs Teams

Advocacy is central to our mission and our work. PPNNE's public affairs teams are getting creative in engaging activists while we shelter in place. Because we know advocacy for sexual and reproductive health care needs cannot stop, we remain committed to ongoing policy work with our respective legislatures and in the community. Our partnerships with other social justice organizations continue as we collectively look toward the 2020 elections. We are seeing a surge of volunteer interest in engaging at this time.

VERMONT

We are cultivating the VT Speakers Bureau by recruiting members and holding monthly virtual storyteller and issue workshops with a focus on passing Prop 5, the constitutional amendment to guarantee reproductive liberty in the state.

NEW HAMPSHIRE

Organizers are holding weekly virtual volunteer nights that combine education on the issues and fun! This month, volunteers had opportunities to participate in our new book club and an online sex trivia night.

MAINE

PPNNE's groundbreaking Bridging the Gap program helps to reduce abortion stigma by engaging Mainers at their doors with in-depth conversations about the issue. These days, new volunteers have begun weekly online trainings and both trainees and experienced volunteers are discussing how they can use their deep canvassing skills on social media platforms or over the phone to continue talking about abortion stigma, Planned Parenthood, and the importance of sexual and reproductive health care – even during this pandemic.



Education In The Time Of COVID-19

PPNNE's Education team continues to work across our region in a variety of ways during this pandemic. Our Peer Education trainings and planning have moved to online learning platforms and we're **providing support to teachers** as education professionals navigate teaching sex education online. In the words of one teacher:
