



Mandated Video to Shame Women Who Seek Abortion Services

HB 124 Rep. Black (R-117) Desloge

HB 124 requires the Department of Health and Senior Services to create a video that contains all the information required to be provided to a woman considering an abortion. If passed, a woman seeking abortion services at least 72 hours in advance would be given state-scripted counseling that includes medically inaccurate information designed to try to change her mind. The same politically charged information would be repeated 3 times; in person, in writing and in the forced viewing of a video.

Coercing women to view a video despite the extensive informed consent process already in place is disrespectful to women and has no place in Missouri law.

This law is about trying to shame a woman out of having an abortion - pure and simple.

Current Missouri law already requires an extensive and burdensome informed consent process for women seeking safe legal abortion. The existing law requires a qualified professional to discuss, in person, 72 hours in advance:

- Offered the opportunity, to view an active ultrasound and listen to the fetal heartbeat if audible.
- State-developed 22 page booklet detailing fetal development at 2-week increments from conception to birth, describing abortion methods, paternity laws, child support, and alternatives to abortion.
- Abortion providers must also post a sign stating that "public and private agencies [are] willing to help you carry your child to term and to assist you and your child after your child is born [...]"
- In addition, the qualified professional must present the woman with the statement: "The life of each human being begins at conception. Abortion will terminate the life of a separate, unique, living human being."
- Short and long term risk factors including any 'psychological or situational factors.'

A politician forcing a doctor to use a video for political — not medical — reasons is a dangerous intrusion into medical care. Laws that require watching a video before an abortion are about politics, not medicine. The measure makes no exceptions for women under any circumstances, including cases of rape, incest, or those who receive a tragic diagnosis during pregnancy. Politics do not belong in the exam room and a doctor should not have to present materials intended to shame a woman because some politicians disagree with her decision. Politicians are not medical experts, but politicians have drafted this legislation with the ultimate goal of restricting access to safe, legal abortion.
