## Breaking down barriers.

During the 2019 legislative session, we made great strides in protecting the rights of Coloradans. Thanks to the leadership of our pro-reproductive and sexual health majorities in the House and Senate, Governor Polis, and YOUR incredible activism, Planned Parenthood Votes Colorado is leading the charge into the future. Here are some of the pieces of legislation we’re most proud of and excited about:

### HB 1032: Comprehensive sex ed is in, misleading abstinence-only sex ed is out

This bill requires that sex education classes include lessons on consent, are inclusive LGBTQ+ students, do not use stigma, shame, or gender stereotypes, and, if schools are teaching about pregnancy outcomes, the lessons must include unbiased information about all options, including abortion care. The bill also provides \$1 million in funding, and ensures the committee overseeing the grant includes a youth representative, representatives of organizations serving LGBTQ+ youth, intersex folks, sexual assault survivors, youth of color, immigrants, educators, and school nurses.

**Status: Passed**

### HB 1039: Trans and nonbinary folks can now update their birth certificates and other identification documents without needing surgery.

People will be able to update their documents without being forced to jump through medically unnecessary hoops. While the road to pass this legislation was long, our trans and nonbinary community came together as one to ensure no one is forced to carry documents with information that don’t reflect who they are.

PPVC Position: Support  
Pro-reproductive health vote: Yes  
**Status: Passed**

### HB 1122: Bringing back the Maternal Mortality Review Committee

This bill reestablishes the Maternal Mortality Review Committee, a group of health care providers and public health experts dedicated to improving maternal mortality outcomes. They collect and review treatment records, identify trends, and determine prevention strategies.

**Status: Passed**

### HB 1129: Prohibiting conversion therapy for minors

This bill prohibits licensed mental health providers from providing so-called “conversion therapy” for minors in Colorado. Conversion therapy is harmful to youth, their families, and their communities.

PPVC Position: Support  
Pro-reproductive health vote: Yes  
**Status: Passed**

### HB 1176: Creating a Health Care Cost Savings task force

This bill brings together a group of experts to analyze several options including single-payer, and allowing people to buy into the state employee’s health plan – to determine how we can really, truly make health care affordable in Colorado.

PPVC Position: Support  
Pro-reproductive health vote: Yes  
**Status: Passed**

### HB 1211: Making insurance prior authorizations more transparent and consistent

This bill requires insurance companies to publish their prior authorization requirements online and reduces the need for prior authorizations for clearly established areas of care – think birth control, STI testing and treatment, hormone therapy, and abortion care – by directing carriers to use consistent, current, clinically based criteria. It doesn’t change what plans do or do not cover, but it will reduce approval times for services that your insurance does cover.

### HB 1224: Ensuring free access to menstrual products for people in custody

Every single person deserve the dignity of unrestricted access to menstrual products. This bill makes sure that no one is denied access to tampons or pads due to incarceration in local jails or prisons.

Pro-reproductive health vote: Yes  
**Status: Passed**

### HB 1301: Health Insurance for Breast Imaging

Nobody should go without routine breast exams or mammograms recommended by their provider because of a lack of insurance coverage. This bill ensures that insurance will cover this care.

**Status: Passed**

**SB 007: Preventing Sexual Misconduct at Higher Education Campuses**

Each higher education institution in Colorado is now required to adopt, update, and publicly publish clear policies on sexual misconduct. At a minimum, colleges and universities must have confidential and nonconfidential reporting options, use the preponderance of the evidence as the evidentiary standard, and outline clear and consistent investigation and adjudication procedures. And institutions can no longer consider prior, irrelevant sexual conduct, or punish students for drug or alcohol violations discovered during an investigation.

PPVC Position: Support  
Pro-reproductive health vote: Yes  
**Status: Passed**

**SB 085: Equal Pay for Equal Work.**

This bill allows employees who believe they are being paid less due to gender-based discrimination to file a lawsuit within two years – and if their employers were indeed paying them less for discriminatory reasons, they’re eligible for three years of back pay. It’s about time.  
PPVC Position: Support

Defending our values.

**HB 1103: Protect Human Life at Conception**

This bill would have effectively banned all abortion care and potentially some forms of birth control and fertility treatments. If passed, this bill would subject providers to criminal prosecution for a Felony 1 offense -- up to and including a lifetime of imprisonment and the death penalty. Criminalizing a health care procedure that 1 in 4 women will have in her lifetime, is an alarming overreach, and not in line with the values of the vast majority of Coloradans. Health care is not a crime, and we’re glad this bill was soundly defeated.

PPVC Position: Oppose  
Pro-reproductive health vote: No  
**Status: Failed**

**HB 1140: Live and Let Live Act**

This bill would have allowed everyone from businesses to landlords to legally refuse services or housing to LGBTQ+ people. It would have also eliminated employment protections for LGBTQ+ folks, and would even have allowed health care providers to refuse treatment to trans folks or people seeking fertility treatments.

PPVC Position: Oppose  
Pro-reproductive health vote: No  
**Status: Failed**

**SB 048: Protect Students from Harmful Material**

Under the guise of protecting students from age-inappropriate or even pornographic materials in schools, this bill would have censored all access to materials with “any description” of “sexual conduct,” including any references to “homosexuality.” We already have laws to protect students from truly inappropriate websites and other materials in schools, but this bill would have banned students from accessing age-appropriate health information, and even from reading books with gay characters. Googling “is it ok to be gay” isn’t pornography, and this bill went way too far.

PPVC Position: Oppose  
Pro-reproductive health vote: No  
**Status: Failed**

**SB 110: Ambulatory Surgical Centers**

One way states try to restrict access to abortion care is to impose medically unnecessary legal requirements on the health care centers where abortion care is provided. The sponsors of this bill claimed that it was about patient safety, but any provider of outpatient procedures -- from abortion care to dermatology – already complies with existing licensing and safety requirements. this was a TRAP law – a targeted regulation of abortion providers – in disguise. It would have pened the doors to prevent patients from accessing the care they need by closing down health centers.

PPVC Position: Oppose  
Pro-reproductive health vote: No  
**Status: Failed**
