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
Breakdown of Affiliate Services

We Are Health Care

Providing Essential Health Care Amid a Global Pandemic

The COVID-19 public health crisis presented us with unprecedented challenges and PPSENFL's response elevated the importance of our mission and defined our work during this time.

Under the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), we are taking all precautions to keep our patients and staff safe. Proudly, all 11 health centers remain open, providing essential, time-sensitive health care services, including abortion.

Every day our patients rely on us for birth control, emergency contraception, STI testing and treatment, lifesaving cancer screenings, gender affirming hormone therapy and compassionate abortion care.

In the early days of the pandemic, we quickly implemented telehealth to ensure patients could safely receive the care they need from the safety of their home. Patients can speak to a clinician from their computer or smartphone and receive care whenever and wherever they need it.

To help our patients who were hit hardest by the effects of COVID-19, we provided financial assistance to our patients who lost their job or health insurance and were unable to pay for services.

This year we also expanded transgender services across our service area, including Gender Affirming Hormone Therapy, to ensure transgender and gender non-conforming patients can receive quality health care in a safe, judgement-free setting.









We Are **Expanding**

As we look back over the past year, we're proud of our many accomplishments. We continued to provide "care no matter what" while also completing two new health center projects.

Our newly renovated Kendall health center reopened in May 2020, allowing us to expand reproductive health care services to the largely underserved population of South Miami-Dade, Homestead and the Florida Keys. Many patients in this area have been hit hardest by the pandemic and rely on Planned Parenthood as their sole health care provider.

In June 2020, and after more than 35 years at our original location in Martin County, we opened in Port St. Lucie to increase access on the Treasure Coast. Our brand-new Treasure Coast Health Center will provide access to underserved areas in St. Lucie and Indian River counties as well as Martin County.

Both these centers provide the full range of reproductive health care services and will expand abortion access in our service area. They provide a safe and supportive place for patients to receive exceptional care where there is no judgement, and all are welcome.



We Are Committed

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Our affiliate will never stop fighting for the right to self-determination. This precious human right is rooted in the ability to make personal decisions about one's own body without judgement. If we have learned anything in 2020 - following the murder of George Floyd - it is that the right to self-ownership and personal safety for Black and brown people is truly precarious in our nation. The fact is, if Black

people do not have the right to bodily autonomy to live their daily lives – or protest the violence against their lives – without the fear of violence or murder, we can never achieve justice, let alone reproductive freedom.

To this end, over this year, PPSENFL deepened our commitment to our diversity and inclusion values. We worked internally and with community partners to confront the systemic racism our patients, our staff, and communities endure. Our diversity work is a journey, shaped by courageous conversations, mutual learning, programmatic investment, and partnerships with our allies for justice.







We Are Community

PPSENFL is deeply committed to the communities we serve. In the early stages of the pandemic, PPSENFL provided its N95 masks to front line medical personnel who were caring for patients infected with the coronavirus or working at testing sites.

Our staff also donated their time to make masks for their colleagues and members of the community when there was a mask shortage. Our Community Health Educators made care packages for a South Florida advocacy center that provides support to young people who have been victims of sexual assault. The packages contained self-care products, journals and words of encouragement from the Planned Parenthood team.

We Are **Education**

PPSENFL provided honest, inclusive, medically accurate sexual health and relationship information to more than 16,500 young people and parents through our education programs, health fairs and community outreach.

Our Peer Education Program L.I.G.H.T. (Leaders Igniting a Generation of Healthy Teens) originated in Broward County and has now expanded to West Palm Beach, Tallahassee and Jacksonville. The Tallahassee L.I.G.H.T.s tabled at the Black Women's Brunch and had the opportunity to discuss the program and provide sexual health information.

In Broward County, the L.I.G.H.T.s led a sexual health presentation at the Gender and Sexuality Alliance (GSA) Summit where they spoke to over 400 students from surrounding schools in the county.

During COVID-19, PPSENFL's L.I.G.H.T. program provided education to over 4,000 students remotely through virtual trainings. During this difficult time, our education department has been a support system for our young people when they need it most.









We Are **Advocates**

Planned Parenthood in Florida grew its supporter base to 844,436 in the last year. Two thirds of our active volunteers are under the age of 24, which demonstrates the massive impact our Public Affairs team has on local colleges and universities.

A new organizing tactic, "relational organizing," was launched and prompted PPFA to pilot additional programs such as "Out Vote". We had over 4,000 volunteer shifts and mobilized 400 individuals in the capitol. The 6th class of volunteers graduated from our nationally celebrated Speakers' Bureau program. These 16 individuals are now trained on how to share their stories and experiences about sexual and reproductive health.

We passed proactive abortion resolutions in Broward and Miami-Dade counties. We expanded coalition partners in the reproductive justice movement including a meaningful relationship with Southern Birth Justice Network and Dignity Florida. We remain an active partner in the Reproductive Freedom Coalition in Florida with 50 + members who engage in statewide campaigns.

COVID-19 has meant readjusting to digital strategies for mobilizing and organizing our base. In March 2020, all events shifted to digital and remote, but this did not stop our organizers. In partnership with Planned Parenthood of Southwest and Central Florida, our organizers mobilized early in the pandemic to build a statewide list of verified COVID-19 resources. Additionally, our Public Affairs team hosted community care and wellness conversations via Zoom and armed their volunteers to help make dozens of masks for our health center staff and patients.



We Are The Future

We know reproductive health care has the power to change lives, change communities and the world.

In 2018, we launched a \$40 million campaign to reflect our commitment to give every person in our 45 county service area equal access to sexual and reproductive health care through 2033. No matter what.

Together, with your help, in just two years we raised over \$21 million. We continue to be able to ensure that everyone can choose their own path to a healthy and meaningful future.

Guarantee free health care for teens and the continuity of the Peer Education Program through 2033.

Since the launch of the campaign, we have implemented new programs, expanded our reach and improved our technology.

WE HAVE:

Provided no cost health care to **3,916 teens** as part of our mission to reduce unintended pregnancy and ensure health care is equal and accessible for all.

Expanded our health care footprint with the purchase of new facilities in three key areas: fast-growing St. Lucie County, south Miami-Dade County and Tallahassee.

Upgraded outdated IT systems to improve our patient experience in the health centers and ensure cybersecurity.

Launched the L.I.G.H.T. (Leaders Igniting a Generation of Healthy Teens) program which is a high school peer to peer education program aimed to decrease negative sexual health outcomes. Trained peer educators were able to provide 13,703 teens with honest and accurate sexual health education in the first two years of the program.


